Furthermore, the vastness of the Engadin offers ideal conditions for cross-country skiers including the famous 42 kilometers of the Engadin Skimarathon, the illuminated night trails and the easy Heart trails.

... spirits away the snow and thus unveils the endless network of trails, the time has come for runners, hikers and bikers. Top athletes use the Engadin for high-altitude training, trail runners leave asphalt and cobblestones far behind and bikers find their "flow" on the wide mountain slopes. The network of trails in the Engadin is said to cover 580 kilometers - maybe nobody knows for sure, but one thing is certain: every kilometer is a true nature experience in itself. With a little luck, even marmots, ibex or chamois can be observed.

... look for and find their way to the Engadin. Magical nature experiences as well as international events attract and inspire visitors. The Alpine Ski World Cup races, the Engadin Skimarathon, the Engadin Art Talks and the Origen Festival Cultural, to name a few, boast legendary reputations and create a colourful event schedule all year round.
