1. Visit the largest whisky bar in the world

Indulge your sinister side at world's largest whisky bar Devil's Place, located at the Waldhaus am See restaurant and hotel in St. Moritz. With over 1000 kinds of whisky to try in this elegant and cosy lounge, you are bound to return to Devil's Place with every visit to St. Moritz.

2. Walk around Lake St. Moritz

Lake St. Moritz is an unmissable natural gem. Take the 4 km walk around the lake first thing in the morning as the sunlight peeks over the pines, or at sunset when rays of pink and orange light reflect off the water. And the lake is just as special in winter when it is frozen into black ice.

6. Visit the Leaning Tower of St. Moritz

Visit the tower even more off-kilter than the Leaning Tower of Pisa – the Leaning Tower of St. Moritz! This slanted structure was part of the old Church of St. Mauritius and is an important landmark just a few minutes' walk from heart of St. Moritz Dorf. You can see the tower's exterior and read a plaque detailing its history, which dates back to the 12th century!

7. Visit the Ice Pavilion in Kulm Park and drink a cocktail at the Kulm Country Club

The 110-year-old pavilion is currently being renovated under the direction of renowned English architect Lord Norman Foster. 8. Have a sip from the St. Moritz healing spring

Indulge yourself in St. Moritz's most ancient tradition of bathing in the local healing mineral spring waters of the Mauritius springs. This nearly 3,500-year-old practice can still be found at the Forum Paracelsus in St. Moritz Bad. The ancient people who first used this water in 1411 BC found that when sick people visited these special springs, their pains and ailments disappeared. 9. Visit the Olympic Stadium

St. Moritz has hosted two Olympic Winter Games: in 1928, which was the first true standalone Winter games, and in 1948. Today, the Olympic Stadium that was used for these games is part of the Kulm Golf Course in the summer. The building, which had not been used for two decades, was restored by famed furniture designer and great friend of St. Moritz, Rolf Sachs. The building is now his home and is always open to visitors.

Mili Weber was born in 1891 in the bilingual Swiss town of Biel/Bienne. She took up drawing and painting at a young age and eventually moved to St. Moritz to live a quiet life in a log cabin. While the cabin itself is architecturally interesting, what really sets this home apart is the paintings that Mili did on her walls and ceilings, transforming the cabin into a wondrous fairyland. Located on Via Dimlej and tucked away in the trees, this magical painted cabin can still be visited today.

14. Afternoon Tea at the Suvretta House

16. Caviar tasting at Glattfelder

For three generations, Glattfelder has been providing their customers with the freshest and best caviar on the market. In fact, it was the Glattfelder family that first brought caviar to the Engadin. At that time during the Second World War, caviar had to be eaten in private and away from the eyes of German spies. Thus the legendary "Caviar Stübli", a private back room to enjoy caviar, was born. While caviar can now be enjoyed anywhere, the Caviar Stübli remains at Glattfelder and is an insider's tip. Advance reservation is required.

17. Eat truffle pizza at Chesa Veglia

In the local language of Romansh, Chesa Veglia means "old house", a fitting name as this is the oldest building in St. Moritz. This beautiful former farmhouse is home to a hotel and the Pizzeria Heuboden. As its name suggests, Italian specialties are served in the old hayloft of the farmhouse. Their Dama Bianca, a white pizza that replaces tomatoes with lots of truffles, sharp and spicy Parmesan, and tender buffalo mozzarella, is probably the most famous pizza in St. Moritz.

18. Eat a roast beef sandwich at Hatecke

Hatecke is a family-owned business that is over 100 years old. Whether you're a casual runner or a frequent marathoner, you will find an event at the St. Moritz Running Festival, taking place 19-21 August 2022. You can take part in the Engadin Summer Run, a 25 km race along the lakes and through the forest, Run Pontresina, Crossing Engiadina, or the Free Fall Vertical, a 6.6 km race that gains over 1000 m of elevation. There is also a Kids Race circuit, and the Festival Village in St. Moritz is a great place to meet friends, eat, do yoga, and listen to live music.

30. Joyride to Tirano

A gem of a small Italian town, Tirano is a little more than an hour's drive from St. Moritz over the stunning Bernina Pass. Enjoy this scenic and exciting drive by car or motorcycle, and once you arrive, treat yourself to an Aperol Spritz on the piazza.

31. Bernina Express St. Moritz-Tirano

If you would like to drink a cocktail on the way to Tirano, we recommend the Bernina Express, a roughly two-and-a-half-hour train ride that takes you from the alpine paradise of St. Moritz down to the palm trees of Tirano. On your way, you will see beautiful views of the Ospizio Bernina, 2,253 m above sea level, and the turquoise waters of Lake Poschiavo. While you travel, you'll be treated to tasty snacks, drinks, and information about the region.

32. Glacier Express to Zermatt

Known as the "world's slowest express train", this nearly eight-hour train trip is unlike any other. From St. Moritz to Zermatt, you will see natural wonders such as the Rhine Gorge, known as the "Grand Canyon of Switzerland", the stunning Oberalp pass, and the UNESCO World Heritage Albula Line with viaducts and a helical tunnel. 33. Walk to the Oscar Niemeyer House on the lake

Oscar Niemeyer was a pioneer of modern architecture and the mastermind behind the Brazilian capital of Brasilia, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. During his long and legendary career, Niemeyer designed just one building in Switzerland: the Oscar Niemeyer Haus on the northern shore of Lake St. Moritz. He was able to witness the completion of his design in 2011 at the age of 104. The building, which resembles a curved sheet of white paper, is now the home and studio of the photographer Florio Puenter.

35. Schellenursli path

The Schellenursli path is a 45-minute trail leading from Salastrains to the Heidihütte and then on to the town of St. Moritz. This beautifully designed trail captures the authentic mountain ambience of the area. As you walk, you will pass magnificent wooden sculptures and panels of text in multiple languages that tell the story of the book *A Bell for Ursli*. And of course, the view is magnificent, with glimpses of St. Moritz coming through the treetops.

36. Nietzsche House

This nearly 200-year-old house in the town of Sils Maria is where famed writer and philosopher Friedrich Nietzsche spent seven summers between 1881 and 1888. In 1958, a group purchased the house, renovated it, and opened a museum there in 1960. Visitors can see treasures such as first edition books and valuable manuscripts. Panels throughout the house provide insight into Nietzsche's philosophical ideas.

37. Giacometti Atelier

In 1906, the famous Swiss painter Giovanni Giacometti converted a small barn in his birthplace of Stampa in Val Bregaglia into an art studio. In this room, Giovanni's children and wife posed as models for his works of art. After he died in 1933, his son Alberto, who was by then a renowned artist himself, used the small studio when he stayed with his mother during the summer. When you visit today, you can still see traces of these two great artists in the small room.

38. Castle Tarasp

The Castle Tarasp in the Lower Engadin was built around 1040 by the Lords of Tarasp, who came to the region from Lake Como. It is now owned and managed by the Not Vital Foundation, which has opened it for guided tours (reservations necessary) and has added a museum to the castle, with a collection of antique, modern, and contemporary art.

39. Muzeum Susch

Located in the remnants of a 12th century monastery in the picturesque town of Susch along the Inn River, this unique museum was opened by Polish entrepreneur Grażyna Kulczyk in 2019. Its focus is on exhibiting women artists (although not exclusively), and it approaches art as a way of making underrepresented voices heard. Take a day trip to this beautiful valley and museum, and be sure to reserve a guided tour in advance.

108. Ski the Hahnensee in winter

The unrivalled best slope in the Engadin is the Hahnensee slope, a 9 km black run that goes from Gian d'Alva on Corvatsch to the Hahnensee Lake and then all the way down to St. Moritz Bad. The slope starts with steep, wide-open slopes and ends with a snowy fairytale forest. And throughout the run, you are treated to breathtaking views of the Engadin lakes.
